School Sales Tax Put on BY NICOLE BRAUCHLI November Ballot After Kingdom Chronicle Staff Dramatic City Council Meeting

The September 5th City Council meeting was met with much anticipation. After reports had surfaced that the new IGA between the Woodland Park School District RE-2 and the City had been signed on August 29th, the general understanding was that this would satisfy the demands by the council and make the ballot initiative unnecessary. The November 5th meeting consequently also started with the report that the school district had agreed to every single demand by the city and had not requested any amendments. The newly signed IGA, thus, requires the school district to change its accounting method to provide for separate accounting of the 1.09% sales tax collected by the city for the benefit of the school district, similarly to a grant process. By January 2025, the district would provide monthly line-by-line reports on the spending of the tax, around 3.2 million USD yearly, of which a large chunk, around 740,000 USD, is deducted to pay back the bond between the city and school district (last payment expected in FY36), and the majority of the remaining funds (around 90%) is used for teachers' salaries.

The City Council meeting was well attended with over an hour dedicated to public comment on the issue, specifically the question whether the sales tax should nevertheless be put on the November 5th ballot for citizens to repeal. Whereas proponents of the ballot initiative mainly voiced their frustration and lack of trust in the school district, the opponents advocated for the new IGA to run its course and reminded the council that the sales tax and the new IGA are exactly designed to bring the transparency the public was crying out for. The ordinance had come about out of frustration of the prior City Council beginning of the year in order to force the school district around the table, an issue that later proved to be more on the city's fault and resulted in a first amended IGA between the city and the school district. The new council, however, was not satisfied enough with the new reporting requirements of the school district and had voted to

If you are not familiar with Charis Bible College, you may not be aware that they spent this last weekend celebrating 30 years of discipling people in the Word of God. This huge milestone was celebrated by all the staff members, many students, and alumni. Friday, September 6th, and Saturday, September 7th, Charis had an amazing lineup of events. As an attendee of the event, I got to watch on Friday how they went through Charis' past and how Andrew Wommack started the Bible College, to how the ministry is doing presently, and, finally, ending with vision-casting for the future.

We got to hear from some people who helped Andrew start the Bible College such as Wendell Parr and Linus and Kay LaFever. Both the LaFever couple and the Parr's prayed about the decision when Andrew first asked them, but it was evident that this was God. Together they began Charis Bible College, originally Colorado Bible Collage, in Colorado Springs in 1994. Kay said "We wouldn't be right here if it weren't for, in the beginning, the "yes". The obedience". Even if they went to Colorado for just one student, that is still a "yes". Andrew stated in this interview "If you wait til you get it figured out before you start, you'll never get it done." Which further exemplifies the value of saying "yes". It was a real treat to see them reflect on humble beginnings and their thankfulness for Andrew and Jamie Wommack's obedience.

For the present, Andrew brought up current staff and instructors such as Barry Bennett; the Executive Director of Academics, Daniel Bennett; CEO, Billy Epperhart; ARMI Ambassador, Greg Mohr; Wendel Parr; and current Directors and Vice Presidents, Mike and Carrie Pickett. Now, Charis Bible College has expanded not only the Colorado campus to Woodland Park, building amazing facilities and growing staff as well, but 53 Charis locations around the world. 21 of those locations are within America. It is safe to say Charis has been busy expanding! There are 14,000 Charis Bible College Alumni as of now. **Continued on Page 2...**

continue the ordinance until the signing of a further adapted IGA, which was completed on August 29th.

After listening to public comment the City Council proceeded to casting its vote. As expected, councilmembers Jones and Harvey, who was involved in the negotiations with the School Board, as well as Mayor Case voted in favor of killing the ballot measure. Councilmembers Geer, Smith, and Baldwin voted in favor of putting the question on the ballot in November. The deciding vote was council-member and mayor pro tem Catherine Nakai, who had previously signaled she was going to vote against the ballot measure should the IGA be signed in time. Struggling to keep her poker-face, Nakai leaned into her microphone and voted "yes".

Outrage erupted in the audience and the council had to call a recess until order was reestablished. And with that, the special sales tax for the School District will be on the ballot on November 5th, where citizens of Woodland Park – and only the citizens of Woodland Park, excluding the larger population of the school district – will vote on whether they want to abolish the sales tax. A yes vote in November will take away 11% of the schools' – including the charter school Merit Academy's – budget starting in July 2025 with dramatic consequences. Considering that most of the sales tax is mainly spent on teacher salaries, that is where the biggest cut would have to be expected. According to the public comment made by Merit Academy's CFO, the sales tax covers 30 full time teacher positions. A 'yes' vote would effectively defund our school district, which is already one of the lowest funded districts nationwide. As a comparison, whereas New York's per pupil funding amounts to 24,881 USD, Colorado only allocates 11,070 USD per child according to World Population Review. This will impact parents, teachers, citizens, and businesses alike, as the sales tax was introduced as a way to limit property taxes and let tourists and other non-citizens, who account for about 30% of the collected sales tax, contribute to the funding of our public schools.

It will be crucial in the next two months, to educate Woodland Park voters on the importance of this tax for the education of our children. As a community, we need to find ways to bridge the divide currently splitting

Each instructor shared how they got connected to Andrew and where the ministry is now. Carrie said it best that, "It is multiplying at such a fast rate".

"One thing that I've really seen here, it starts with Andrew and goes all the way down through the staff is that there's a genuine love for the transformation for people and for students," said Mike Pickett during the interview. Billy explained that within the last 5 to 6 years, they have actually doubled the size of the ministry – what a statement! On top of that, they have recently reached their goal of 1,000 enrolled students in Woodland Park alone!

To look to the future, they showed the continual growth with the upcoming Gospel Truth Network, launching this month with programs for people of all ages. The new Student housing was also shown since its opening this school year for woman - making Charis history. This dorm being the first of many for both males and females. 3-D rendering was shown of the massive, 1 Billion dollar expansion as well. Andrew shared, "We need to make this so that people don't have to do without something," which God spoke to him concerning this expansion. I love this because it shows the abundance God has for us, but, also, the extent that these Executives are going with this project. It is safe to say I was not the only one there just in awe of all that is part of the vision.

Andrew formally and publicly announced that Mike and Carrie Pickett will be taking over the ministry, taking his own position. This coincided with Mike Pickett's ordination. However, Andrew made it clear that he is not going anywhere anytime soon. The state of things was compared to Joshua and Moses. This decision was made almost 4 years ago when Andrew asked them if they would be willing and since then he has been



September 5th City Council Meeting

Last Thursday our city council voted 4-3 to pass an ordinance that will put the 1.09% tax back on the November ballot for the voters to vote on. I want to share the importance of maintaining our 1.09% city sales tax, which is dedicated to funding our schools in the Re-2 School District.

Let me start by sharing some critical numbers. WPSD Re-2, like many districts across Colorado, is facing significant financial challenges. Our state ranks 42nd in the nation for per-pupil funding. WPSD RE-2 receives significantly less funding per student compared to many other districts in Colorado. This means our schools are already operating on far less than the national average.

The 1.09% sales tax we have in Woodland Park generates approximately \$3.2 million annually for our school district. This funding is absolutely essential. It helps us keep class sizes manageable, retain high-quality teachers, and offer vital programs such as music, art, athletics, and more.


Without this tax, our schools will face devastating cuts. According to the Colorado Department of Education, more than 80% of school budgets are spent on staff salaries and benefits. If this funding were to disappear, we'll be looking at teacher layoffs, larger class sizes, and a significant reduction in the programs that make our schools special.

Consider what has happened in other districts where funding has been cut. Class sizes have increased by 20%, elective courses have been slashed by nearly 40%, and students—especially those from low-income families—are falling further behind. We cannot allow this to happen in Woodland Park. Our children deserve better.

As it stands right now, not only do Woodland Park residents that choose to shop here help fund our schools but so do all the visitors that come to and through our city, as well as the residents of surrounding cities, both within and outside the RE-2 district. We've all heard the saying, "many hands make light work". All the visitors and travelers making purchases in our city make the burden on the residents of the RE-2 district lighter. To be able to fund our schools in this way is a beautiful thing.

When you see this measure on the ballot, vote "NO"!

Their arguments were lack of transparency, needed maintenance repairs, alleged mismanagement of funds, etc., all things that would speak in favor of keeping the special sales tax and the newly signed IGA that binds the school district into monthly line by line reporting on the use of the tax money. Without the sales tax, the school district would have no reporting duty towards the city anymore.

Unfortunately, in the end and despite all the public comment, the City Council voted 3:4 in favor of putting the sales tax on the November ballot for the citizens of Woodland Park - not the county mind you - to decide on, a result that even surprised our mayor. They questioned the overall assumption in the room that voters would reject the sales tax and stated that voters will be able to vote in the best interest of the children and would not vote based on emotions. Wouldn't that be a novel thought. After six council-members had made their public statement, the deciding vote rested on council-member Smitty, who claims that all the parents and teachers he talks to, want this issue on the ballot. The fact that 30 teachers would lose their job without the tax, as Merit Academy's CFO pointed out, did not affect him. According to him, teachers are already expecting to lose their job. The rhetoric is mind blowing.

We have our work cut out for the next few months. It will be of utmost importance that we inform voters by November, what they are voting on and the potential consequences this will have on our kids. If you want to be on board and would be willing to write letters to the editor or be part of other campaign activities such as door-knocking, social media, etc. please let us know! In line with this note, I would like to leave you with the following reminder of history and of the first Continental Congress that took place these days exactly 250 years ago (credit to Wallbuilders, thank you Sue for forwarding!):

On September 5, 1774, the First Continental Congress met at Carpenters' Hall in Philadelphia. Among the delegates who attended were George Washington, Patrick Henry, Samuel Adams, John Adams, John Jay, and many other notables. This meeting was important since it was the first time the colonies united on a large scale (though one colony was not represented), thus the tone it set would be crucial for America's future. The congress had been called to address increasing British tyranny, including the Intolerable Acts, which had ended self-government in Massachusetts and shut down the port of Boston to commercial shipments.

On the second day of the gathering, Congress got down to business. There was a call to open the meeting with prayer, but some delegates doubted they could pray together since there were different denominations present. Samuel Adams ended the debate when he announced that he was not a bigot and could "hear a prayer" from anyone "who was at the same time a friend to his country." He then nominated Rev. Jacob Duché to conduct the prayers. It was amidst all these circumstances that on the third day, September 7th, the Rev. Duché led the first prayer in Congress.

Delegate Silas Deane reported Duché prayed for a full ten minutes and then read the Scripture for the day. John Adams related to his wife how much this time of prayer meant for the attendees:

[Rev. Duché] read several prayers in the established form, and then read the collect for the seventh

day of September, which was the thirty-fifth Psalm. You must remember, this was the next morning after we heard the horrible rumor of the cannonade of Boston. I never saw a greater effect upon an audience. It seemed as if Heaven had ordained that Psalm to be read on that morning.

That time of prayer united the delegates despite their differences. In fact, Daniel Webster, "Defender of the Constitution," later reminded the US Supreme Court of the unifying power of prayer:

Mr. Duché read the Episcopal service of the Church of England and then, as if moved by the occasion, he broke out into extemporaneous prayer. And those men who were then about to resort to force to obtain their rights, were moved to tears; and flood of tears, Mr. Adams says, ran down the cheeks of the pacific Ouakers who formed part of the most interesting assembly. Depend upon it, where there is a spirit of Christianity, there is a spirit which rises above form, above forms, independent of sect or creed, and the controversies of clashing doctrines.



Theologians are often accused of making knowledge about God unnecessarily complicated. Scholars of the Bible are known for giving long, verbose answers to short questions. (In all fairness, however, the more complicated a subject the less likely a brief answer is to be adequate. And certainly the Lord – and our knowledge of His revelation – are subjects with so many layers of content that the odds for wordy answers and discourse is great).

Regarding apologetics (the discipline of defending the Christian faith), getting tangled up in depth of content is just an occupational hazard. I once heard a TV preacher (clearly, no fan of apologetics), say that, "Apologists could make falling off a stool complicated!" Perhaps so. Picture all that comes to mind in some one, "falling off a stool": ("What kind of stool was it?" "Why did the subject fall, and how far?", "Did he have an aneurism?", "Was the stool in a bar, and was the fall was due to intoxication on the subject's part? Because this raises discussion about the subjects of sin and salvation...").

If one sincerely wants to find out truth, then having to sift through some content to get there should not be viewed as completely burdensome. It is usually beneficial. Because on the way to solving one specific question the diligent seeker will likely come across other truths. This is certainly so regarding the message of Jesus. The Gospel of salvation through Christ is endlessly fascinating, I believe, because it is profound and simple. The brightest scholars exhaust their stock of adjectives in attempting to depict it, yet a child may understand the love of Jesus, too. And reality's two most indelible precepts – that God exists and that He loves me – stir our hearts to countless other topics of discussion as well.

The Quests: Make it simple, make it vivid

While fielding questions in an open-forum college class, a student gave me a request that mandated simplicity: Describe Christianity in just two words. Could you do it? Only two words, in which to explain the message of history. How would you respond?

I thought for a moment, said a silent prayer, and replied, "Loving substitution." Fortunately, the class gave

gave me a few moments longer in which to explain. But one with even a basic knowledge of the Bible knows that God, in love, sent His Son to die on the cross in our place. I believe this "loving substitution" is what Isaiah 53:5 means when it said, "The chastisement of our peace was upon Him." One modern translation renders this, "Everything we've done wrong was piled on Him (Jesus)." That is God's "loving substitution."

The life of Anthony Perez was a poignant picture of "loving substitution." In a New York park, the 11-year old gave his life to save a drowning pal. The friend had fallen through the ice of a small pond in the park, and Anthony entered the water to save him. The friend was pushed to shore and lived. Young Anthony didn't make it. Emergency responders got hypothermia trying to save him, but to no avail. Hailed as a hero, Anthony did for a friend what Jesus did for the world: He laid down his own life.

Painful as it would be, Jesus jumped into the icy water for us. Think about His "loving substitution" when you need to be reminded how much God loves you. Perhaps you'll have opportunity to share this precious truth with others today who are longing to hear it. Through words or in real-life actions, what a privilege we have to convey simple, though life-changing truth.
