Woodland Park News In Brief

On January 1, 2025, the city's new Short Term Rental (STR) provisions will take effect. This means that STR's will no longer be allowed within residential areas unless it is the primary residence of the owner and the owner is present during the duration of the guest's stay. The exact ordinance and zoning provisions can be found on the city's website. The city has sent out three different letters to all current STR license owners outlining the changes coming into effect January 1st. The city urges property owners to apply for new licenses ahead of time to allow for processing before the end of the year. All property owners of STR's outside of zoning requirements should have received a cease and desist by December 31, 2024 letter. In order to assist citizens in navigating the new regulations, the city created an STR resource center on its website.

The new regulations, voted in by citizens' initiative in 2023, are currently subject of a lawsuit by property owners against the city. Heart of the lawsuit is the question whether current license holders are required by Colorado law to be "grandfathered in", meaning, they should be allowed to continue to operate based on a previously legal zoning practice. Proponents of the new regulations argue that STR's were never an allowed or regulated zoning practice within residential areas but were simply tolerated by the city in the absence of clear regulations. The plaintiffs are hoping to receive a ruling before the end of the year allowing current STR owners to continue to operate.

The Woodland Park Police Department welcomed citizens at its monthly Community Engagement Forum on November 20th. One of the topics discussed was the upcoming holiday season and the attraction of possible criminals. Chief Deisler reminded attendants not to place large cardboard boxes and packaging of valuable Christmas presents outside to not attract break ins. The police department is exploring options to have a large dumpster accessible to citizens for that purpose throughout the holiday season. Package theft is luckily not

Residents are urged to take deliveries inside promptly or have a neighbor or friend take hold of them in the meantime. Another option presented by a citizen was that of a lockable box outside for delivery drivers to place packages in.

The Woodland Park Police Department has seen a significant decrease in criminal activity in town since adopting a new strategy that involves increased traffic enforcement and police presence on high traffic roads. Although this does not necessarily mean a rise in speeding tickets, the simple visible presence of patrol cars serves as a natural deterrent to any potential trouble makers. The police department recently ordered four new pick up trucks to add to its fleet that will ensure operations during any type of winter weather.

Community Engagement Forums by the Woodland Park Police Department are held every third Wednesday of the month at 6 p.m. either at the Police Department or the Ute Pass Cultural Center. It is a great way for citizens to get to know our local force, receive updates, and ask questions. The next forum will take place in January. The Police Department will again conduct its Santa patrols through the city beginning of December and is also planning a "pictures with Santa" event. Details will be published on its Facebook page ahead of time.

Open Positions on Various City Committees

The City of Woodland Park is currently accepting applications for various open positions on different committees. These committees perform important work in our city and most of them meet once or twice a month, provided there are agenda items to be dealt with. This is an excellent way to get involved as citizens and shape the decisions and policies of our city.

Board of Adjustment

The Woodland Park Board of Adjustment (BOA) is a seven-member quasi-judicial board consisting of five regular members plus two alternate members all appointed by City Council to three-year (or vacated member incomplete) terms. The BOA conducts public hearings upon submittal of a request to vary zoning or of a request to appeal an administrative decision.

Applicants must be available to meet on the third Monday of each month at 6:30 p.m. in-person or virtually, must be at least eighteen years old, a city resident for not less than one year, and possess qualifications that are compatible with the Board's purpose and authority.

There are currently 2 alternate positions open on this board with terms that will expire on January 1, 2028.

Board of Review

The Board of Review (BOR) is focused on the application and interpretation of the Pikes Peak Regional Building Code as adopted and set forth in Chapter 15.02 of the Municipal Code. The BOR hears and decides appeals of order, decisions or determinations made by the Building Official, grants minor variances, and hears complaints regarding licensed contractors. The BOR is a Council-appointed 5-member quasi-judicial board (complete with two additional alternate members) with each member serving 3-year terms.

Applicants must be available to meet on the third Thursday of each month at 3:30 p.m., must be at least eighteen years old; and possess qualifications that are compatible with the Committee's purpose and authority.

The term of this open position will end on January 1, 2028.

Planning Commission

The Planning Commission is a nine-member advisory board established to assist the City Council in

providing for orderly development within the City of Woodland Park. The Planning Commission conducts public hearings related to new subdivisions, zoning changes, conditional use permits, flood hazard development permits, and changes to the Subdivision or Zoning Regulations. The Planning Commission is also charged with preparation and amendments to the City's Comprehensive Plan.

Applicants must be available to meet on the second and fourth Thursday evenings at 6:30 p.m. of each month in person or virtually, be at least eighteen years old; a city resident for not less than one year and possess qualifications that are compatible with the Board's purpose and authority.

There are four regular member positions available with the terms expiring on January 1, 2028.

Charter Review Committee

The Charter Committee is an ad-hoc committee established by the City Council on average every two years, in order to review the City's charter and discuss suggested amendments to be put on the next suitable ballot for citizens to vote on.

The Charter Committee is made up of two councilmembers, two – four citizens, the City Manager, City Clerk and City Attorney. The council may appoint a minimum of two positions with a maximum of four positions to this Committee. These positions will expire in February of 2026. Interested applicants for this position must be a City resident for a minimum of one year prior to appointment, 18 years of age and be available to meet on a monthly basis.

Application forms for all open positions are available on the City's website or at the City Clerk's office in City Hall, 220 West South Avenue in Woodland Park. Completed applications must be submitted to the City Clerk's office and may be delivered via email to sleclercq@woodlandpark.gov; or delivered by mail to the City Clerk at PO Box 9007, Woodland Park, CO 80866 not later than noon, on Thursday, December 19, 2024.
