New Laws In Colorado By Nicole Brauchli Kingdom Chronicle Staff To Ring in 2025

As the new year approaches, Colorado residents should prepare for several legislative changes taking effect on January 1, 2025. Here's an overview of the ones that will impact your everyday life the most:

Cage-Free Eggs Now Mandatory

Starting January 1, all eggs sold in Colorado must come from cage-free facilities. This mandate, passed in 2020, also requires producers in Colorado with more than 3,000 hens to maintain a cage-free environment. These new regulations were passed by the legislator under threat from an animal advocacy group that promised to introduce a ballot measure if lawmakers didn't act.

Hands-Free Driving Becomes Law

To combat distracted driving, hand-held phone use while driving is now completely prohibited. While texting while driving was already banned, it will now also be illegal to make calls while holding a phone. Hands-free technology is required, with exceptions for emergencies. Violators face a \$75 fine for the first offense and a twopoint deduction from their license, with harsher penalties for repeat infractions.

Stricter Car Seat Rules

For families, child car seat regulations are tightening. Children under 2 years old who weigh less than 40 pounds must now use rear-facing seats. Forwardfacing seats are allowed for children aged 2 to 4 who weigh at least 20 pounds, while booster seats are only permitted for kids aged 4 to 9 who weigh at least 40 pounds. Regular seat belts can be used starting at age 9, a one year change to the current law allowing seat belts starting age 8. In summary, car seat regulations will look as follows from now on:

Under 2 years old and <40 lbs: Must use rearfacing car seats.

- 2-4 years and ≥20 lbs: Can use forward-facing seats in the back seat (if available).
- 4-9 years and \geq 40 lbs: Booster seats permitted.
- Age 9+: Children may transition to regular seat belts.

Secure Gun Storage in Vehicles

Gun owners must also take note of stricter firearm storage requirements. Handguns stored in unattended vehicles must now be locked in hard-sided containers out of view. Other firearms can be secured in soft-sided containers if locked. The rules include exceptions for hunters, peace officers, and others, but generally aim to reduce firearm thefts and enhance safety.

Minimum Wage Increase

The minimum wage will rise to USD \$14.81 per hour, a 2.7% increase up from USD \$14.42 in 2024. For tipped workers, the new rate will be USD \$11.79 per hour. These adjustments reflect inflation through the Consumer Price Index. In comparison, the federal minimum wage remains at a stagnant 2009 rate of USD \$7.25.

Open Positions on Various City Committees

The City of Woodland Park is currently accepting applications for various open positions on different committees. These committees perform important work in our city and most of them meet once or twice a month, provided there are agenda items to be dealt with. This is an excellent way to get involved as citizens and shape the decisions and policies of our city.

Board of Adjustment

The Woodland Park Board of Adjustment (BOA) is a seven-member quasi-judicial board consisting of five regular members plus two alternate members all appointed by City Council to three-year (or vacated member incomplete) terms. The BOA conducts public hearings upon submittal of a request to vary zoning or of a request to appeal an administrative decision.

Applicants must be available to meet on the third Monday of each month at 6:30 p.m. in-person or virtually, must be at least eighteen years old, a city resident for not less than one year, and possess qualifications that are compatible with the Board's purpose and authority.

There are currently 2 alternate positions open on this board with terms that will expire on January 1, 2028.

Board of Review

The Board of Review (BOR) is focused on the application and interpretation of the Pikes Peak Regional Building Code as adopted and set forth in Chapter 15.02 of the Municipal Code. The BOR hears and decides appeals of order, decisions or determinations made by the Building Official, grants minor variances, and hears complaints regarding licensed contractors. The BOR is a Council-appointed 5-member quasi-judicial board (complete with two additional alternate members) with each member serving 3-year terms.

Applicants must be available to meet on the third Thursday of each month at 3:30 p.m., must be at least eighteen years old; and possess qualifications that are compatible with the Committee's purpose and authority.

The term of this open position will end on January 1, 2028.

Planning Commission

The Planning Commission is a nine-member advisory board established to assist the City Council in

providing for orderly development within the City of Woodland Park. The Planning Commission conducts public hearings related to new subdivisions, zoning changes, conditional use permits, flood hazard development permits, and changes to the Subdivision or Zoning Regulations. The Planning Commission is also charged with preparation and amendments to the City's Comprehensive Plan.

Applicants must be available to meet on the second and fourth Thursday evenings at 6:30 p.m. of each month in person or virtually, be at least eighteen years old; a city resident for not less than one year and possess qualifications that are compatible with the Board's purpose and authority.

There are four regular member positions available with the terms expiring on January 1, 2028.

Charter Review Committee

The Charter Committee is an ad-hoc committee established by the City Council on average every two years, in order to review the City's charter and discuss suggested amendments to be put on the next suitable ballot for citizens to vote on.

The Charter Committee is made up of two councilmembers, two – four citizens, the City Manager, City Clerk and City Attorney. The council may appoint a minimum of two positions with a maximum of four positions to this Committee. These positions will expire in February of 2026. Interested applicants for this position must be a City resident for a minimum of one year prior to appointment, 18 years of age and be available to meet on a monthly basis.

Application forms for all open positions are available on the City's website or at the City Clerk's office in City Hall, 220 West South Avenue in Woodland Park. Completed applications must be submitted to the City Clerk's office and may be delivered via email to sleclercq@woodlandpark.gov; or delivered by mail to the City Clerk at PO Box 9007, Woodland Park, CO 80866 not later than noon, on Thursday, December 19, 2024.
