City Council Recap

The June 6th Woodland Park City Council meeting started off with the swearing in of a new police officer. It was the highlight of the night to see someone starting off their career in law enforcement surrounded by superiors, colleagues, family, and community. We are thankful for Woodland Park Police as they serve our community and pray for safety as they go about their duties.

The Pikes Peak Regional Building Department gave a presentation on how all our buildings would need to be modified to meet the various energy saving goals passed in Denver. The goals seemed to be way too lofty and downright unachievable. It was more legislation passed to make a certain constituency feel better for a time, but unachievable in the end.

Another piece of good news was the approval of a contract to repair the various streets here in Woodland Park that are in such dire need of help. The approval was unanimous, and we all look forward to seeing the improvements in our city. But it was the public comment time that heated up the night.

A representative of the school board's District Accountability Committee (DAC) presented that the City Council should listen to their recommendations. He laid out a few issues that the DAC had requested the Council to act on, but the Council had been unresponsive. One issue even involved a crossing guard being struck by a car, but no action has been taken by the Council to improve the intersection.

Another member of the DAC requested that the issue of taking away the 1.09% be taken out of future discussions. The tax supports our schools, particularly in technology, and was voted in by a solid majority of Woodland Park residents back in 2016. However, the ending of the tax has become a main issue for this City Council. The heated rhetoric about the School Board from the City Council, including insinuations of fraud, has revealed a very polarizing divide in our community. A few others also asked the City Council to not remove the tax. They stated that the schoolchildren would needlessly suffer so the Council could log a win against political opponents. **Continued on Page 3...**

Abiding: A Devotional

As believers, we follow God. He is now our Lord and our savior. Just like a child can often be a spitting image of his or her mother or father, in the same way we have been called to be the spitting image of Christ. We know the Word says that we have been made in the image of God; we are, also, called to know the Father in intimacy. So, not only has your whole being been made after the likeness of God, but your soul was meant to experience and draw from the Father constantly. That was our intended purpose. We see in different parts of the Bible, like in John 14:10, where Jesus shows his strong connection and dependence on the Lord. In John 15, Jesus goes into more depth. He says “Remain in me” and emphasizes that we are to be attached to him, the branch. This is the first concept I want to unfold.

“Remain in me, and I will remain in you. For a branch cannot produce fruit if it is severed from the vine, and you cannot be fruitful unless you remain in me. Yes, I am the vine; you are the branches. Those who remain in me, and I in them, will produce much fruit. For apart from me you can do nothing.” John 15:4-5

However, there needs to be a transition period where, as we get older into teen years, we become more dependent on the Lord. We grow our relationship with Him and trust in Him. If we always have to draw on a person, we will run dry. I don’t care if it is your own mom or dad, or maybe a mentor or friend, they will leave you dry. It

doesn’t matter how spiritual they are because they are not God. Personally, I think this deep relationship with God is really lacking in the body of Christ, or at least in the Christians I’ve met at my age. We were made for that dependence, that is why Jesus said, “Remain in me and I will remain in you”, that sentence shows perfectly my description of this connection. It is a two way street. You draw on the Father for everything you need and seek Him, and He brings guidance, correction, love, fulfillment, power and so much more. I want to illustrate this yes because it is the center of our calling, but, also, because this next verse has been ringing in my mind for a handful of weeks and we can so easily make it law that we will never see the fruit of what Jesus actually meant. Read John 13:34

There is a deeper issue there and knowing the Love of God free us. So again, it starts with knowing his love.

"Dear friends, let us continue to love one another, for love comes from God. Anyone who loves is a child of God and knows God. But anyone who does not love does not know God, for God is love." I John 4:7-8

That is not all though because we see here that a child of God loves. As His sons and daughters we were made to love others with the love of Christ. So, yes, you and I were made to receive from the Father with that connection we talked about earlier, but there comes a point where we are to give it. Uninformed City Council Considers Defunding Schools

Amidst the tensions between the Woodland Park City Council and the Woodland Park School District the newly elected City Council is currently considering canceling the special sales tax of 1.09% that was voted in by the citizens in 2016, suggesting that it is no longer needed. The respective agenda item was introduced by the former City Council in an act of frustration over the parties' struggles to find a mutual meeting time beginning of the year. It was later revealed through disclosure of email communications that the city was actually responsible for the delay. The City Council then refused to take the item off the agenda until the newly negotiated and adapted intergovernmental agreement was signed. The signing of the agreement took place in the middle of the announcement of the closure of Gateway Elementary causing another stir and leading the City Council to table the agenda item regarding the special sales tax until July 2024. Despite the school board's noticeable effort to attend council meetings and provide regular reports on the school district happenings, the relationship has not improved. At the May meeting, the council made it very clear that it is ready to repeal the sales tax, even though the funds are needed for our students now more than ever.

The special sales tax was introduced in 2016 to bridge the significant state under-funding of our public schools. Colorado is among the bottom ten states of education funding nationwide and is currently funding schools at 1989 levels. All the while, living costs have risen, the schools' required contributions into PERA (retirement fund) have doubled, average household salary expectations have risen by USD 20, and costs for special education, other support services, and transportation have increased as well. These factors made it impossible for the school district to offer competitive or even livable wages to teachers and retain sufficient staff. To tackle this issue the school board came up with the very creative idea to propose a special sales tax instead of the inevitable increase in property taxes. The sales tax would effect citizens based on their consumption instead of property owned, not further burden our businesses, and profit from the many tourists coming through town, who make up about one third of the sales tax income. The idea was appreciated by the City Council at the time and accepted by the voters with a strong majority.

In 2021, the school board hired a facilities

consulting firm. The firm's facility study reported over USD 34 million in needed repairs and updates to the district's facilities over the next ten years. These improvements are scheduled and allocated every year and only possible through a bond that the school district pays back in yearly contributions taken from the sales tax revenue (listed as COP in the district's budget – Certificate of Participation). The final payment is estimated to occur by the fiscal year 36.

Tasked with the responsible management of its funds, the school district also analyzed its building usage. With the declining student enrollment and rising costs, the closure of Gateway Elementary had been discussed since 2012. All the current buildings are only being used at a 40-45% capacity, and so the consolidation of schools was inevitable long term.

The special sales tax is, therefore, still very much needed. Doing away with it would not only harm the students but would also ultimately lead to higher property taxes for everyone. And finally, such a unilateral decision would also override the clear will of the citizens of Woodland Park. If you can, please go and attend the next few City Council meetings and speak up for the protection of our children.

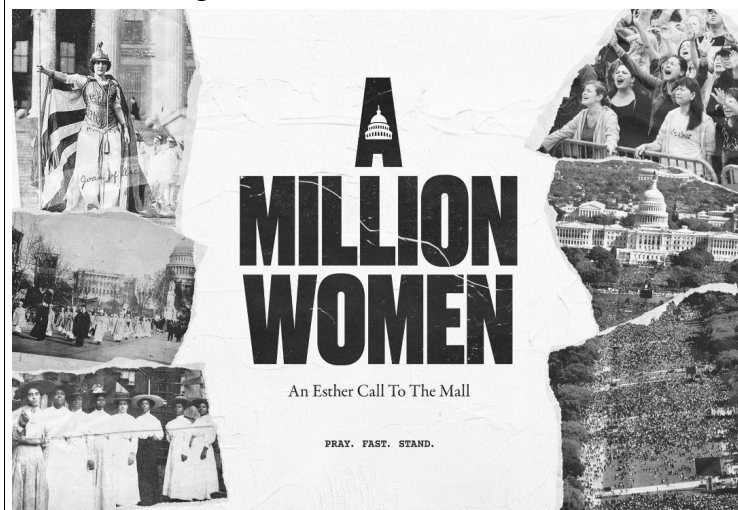

Love Letters With God – The Beginning


